
Conducting a Search of a Building


- Discuss duties and communication (3 whistles for emergency)
- Conduct a 360 degree walk around of the building and report findings
- Knock on door and announce yourself
- □ Feel the door (back of hand, bottom to top)
- Mark the wall (slash and time entering)
- Brace outward opening door with foot while opening
- Prop open door
- Leave a light in the opening
- Call out to victims
- Receive walking wounded at the door
- □ Proper search technique against the wall
- Triage victims
- Document & report findings outside on the door
- □ Develop plan to remove victims blanket carry
- Mark the wall when finished



Question: When should you move a patient? (Only if the situation is unsafe or you don't have enough people to have someone stay with them)

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The search should be systematic. Make a decision. Right turns or left turns only.



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
